Dear Professor Atkinson :

I am contacting you on behalf of the leadership of the Coalition on Intercollegiate Athletics to invite you to join COIA. The Coalition is an alliance of faculty senates and councils at schools in the NCAA's Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS, formerly Division I-A), devoted to addressing major problems in college sports through faculty engagement at local and national levels. COIA is the only national group of elected faculty in the country. The Coalition was founded in 2002 and has grown to 59 member senates or councils, almost half of the total number of FBS schools, with faculty representatives from five different conferences serving on the national Steering Committee. COIA's mission, core values and goals are found below.

The problem of how to integrate intercollegiate athletics with academics on campuses is enormous, as is the challenge to protect students' health and safety. In recent years, that the onus is on the faculty to oversee athletics has become evident. The question is, how to engage faculty? COIA believes that the best work can be done locally, and that faculty can make a difference by speaking up about ways student athletes can be integrated academically and their physical, social and psychological well-being ensured.

Chair, Bonnie Ownley (U Tenn); Vice Chair, Joan King (LSU); Secretary, Jane Albrecht (Wake Forest U); Past Chair, Mike Bowen (USF); Chair of Administration and Communication Committee, Kelley Withy (U Hawaii); Chair of Student Athlete Welfare Committee, Scott Gwozdz (U Colorado); Chair of Academic Integrity Committee, Adrien Bouchet (U Tulsa); at-large member 1 year, Larry Gramling (U Conn); at-large 2 years, John Putman (SDSU).

In 2018-19, Adrien Bouchet will lead a COIA study on academic integrity collecting data through a survey or surveys of FARs, athletics departments, provosts, Senate presidents and COIA representatives, with

the goal of creating ideas of best practices. Please be on the lookout for the survey, and respond to it as soon as possible.

Finally, please be aware that, after discussion at the Annual Meeting, held April 21, 2018, in Boulder, Colorado, the membership voted to recommend inviting the 125 NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) schools to join COIA. Before the Steering Committee goes any further with this recommendation, it is soliciting opinions of member schools not in attendance.

The COIA Steering Committee hopes to work with you, your COIA representative and your Faculty Senate or Council this year.
