APPENDIX B

From Scott Gordon:

Here is the Week -2 graduate enrollment report for the Spring 2019 term. Compared to last year, enrollment is -164.

In terms of student type, the largest drop is among continuing students (-94, not shown in tables below), which is consistent with the drop in enrollment in the Fall 2018 term. In terms of residency, the number of Kentucky residents is -169 compared to the previous spring, though some minor portion of that may be masked by the increase in military students. While enrollment at all degree levels is less than a year ago, master's program enrollment shows the largest deficit at -126. International student enrollment is down (-8), but at a much smaller rate than seen in previous semesters.

Spring enrollment historically ramps up significantly during the first weeks of January, so it will be interesting to see if the trend continues.

Note: this report uses unduplicated headcount, which counts each student only in their primary program/department. This predominantly affects certificate program enrollments, as they tend to be secondary programs. If you need more specific information about duplicated headcount (i.e., students simultaneously enrolled in multiple programs), please let me know.
