#### **Old Business:**

Learning outcomes currently exist all we are doing is updating for SACSCOC. The question is why does it have to be a full review instead of expedited. Nee, also thought it didn't need to be a full review and is willing to do expedited. Others agreed.

Laves spoke briefly about the issue.

Flener asked the group what they wanted to do moving forward.

Lindsey supports to let it go and let Senate make the change on the floor.

Hudepohl did say it could be a friendly amendment on the floor.

Go through Senate on Thursday and as presented they mention the conversation held today and do a friendly amendment on the floor.

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Moving forward at senate and asking for a friendly amendment to change to expedited process to allow for cleanup.
