BEC gave recommendation for 2% pay raise pool that included no merit pay, splitting pool to get some faculty to minimum band, and giving 1% across the board.

M.McKerral: Discussed his pay and what a 1% pay raise will be and expressed concern over lack of resources being directed towards compensation and how that will negatively impact university in long term.

L. Elkind: Asked if budget adjustment to college budget will affect pay raise pool.

Provost: Pay raise pool is not on table to be cut. Discussed base budget model with state and how faculty may be able to persuade state to increase.

K. Atkinson: Discussed current funding model from the state and suggests voicing concerns to representatives.
