2) Old Business

a. Question to Registrar about the public availability of course schedules via TopNet

- i. Prior to the monthly meeting, Jennifer Hammonds replied, expressing that she and the Provost's office are still investigating the topic and it would need feedback from university administration. The sense is that administration hopes to address specific concerns rather than implement a whole policy.
- ii. Some committee members feel this wouldn't do enough, specifically about the course location being available, because some other academic institutions don't have this information publicly available. It was advised to gather examples of these institutions as supporting evidence.

b. Annual welfare survey

- i. The primary purpose of this meeting was to review the survey questions and make minor edits and/or additions prior to distribution. Questions related to DEI were edited to still retain the question's primary premise, but with alternative language.
- ii. The target distribution date is Wed, 18 Feb 2026.
