SGA Senate Meeting Minutes

- The fourteenth meeting of the sixteenth Senate was called to order by Ryan Richardson at 5:00pm on January 23rd, 2018.
- The minutes from the last Senate meeting were approved by unanimous consent.
- President Andi Dahmer: The main purpose of today's meeting is to plan for the February 6th rally for higher education. We would like to conclude our meetings at the capital by 1pm in order to be back in time for senate that night. There will be two student speakers at the rally so if you would like to speak, submit a speech to Andi's personal email. We are facing significant budget cuts of 40 million dollars so it's imperative that we start sharing our vision for the university as students. There is a place on TopNet where you can now click to share your vision. Andi would also like senators to put additional focus on strategic planning this semester. Committee chairs all need to meet with either Andi or Ryan. We have also had record few drops from senate this semester and there will be a new appointment tonight.
