Creating an Online State Registered Nurse Aide (SRNA) Program

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What are SRNAs?

Formerly called CNAs

Work in hospitals, long term care facilities, homecare

Provide basic patient care:

Tasks of daily living (bathing, toileting, dressing, feeding, bed making)

Measuring vital signs, height, weight, reporting changes in condition to nurse



SRNA Course Requirements

State requirement -- 59 hours of didactic training

State requirement – 16 clinical hours in a long term care facility.

AHEC program requirement -- Two 8 hour practice days at the WKU School of Nursing



AHEC's SRNA Program

Created in 2015 to meet the needs of WKU pre-PA students and quickly expanded to meet the needs of other healthcare majors

Offered twice a year

Blended online and in-person course

Online content purchased from the Health Education Center (HEC)






Student Benefits
