WKU Libraries Affordable Textbook Initiative 2020 Sisterhood Grant Final Report

Impact: In Fall 2020, the Affordable Textbook Initiative will save **571** students an estimated **\$69,803** (based on the average cost of the previously assigned textbook).

Activities: The Affordable Textbook Initiative 2020, funded through generous support from WKU Sisterhood, awarded ten \$1,500 grants to faculty who replaced a traditional textbook with a free or low-cost alternative. WKU Libraries and CITL offered assistance to all grant recipients in identifying textbook alternatives and updating syllabi and assignments. Due to Covid-related changes in teaching assignments and modalities, one grant recipient dropped out (those funds will be used for a 2021 grant), and one postponed implementation until 2021.
