To maintain safety at this level of care, the consumer must be capable of contracting for safety, follow direction, and be medically stable. Walk-in services are also available. The major function of the ACSU include providing stabilization services to consumers in crisis which will assist them in their return to a pre-crisis level of functioning, assisting consumers and family members in resolving issues/situations that may have precipitated the crisis, and providing linkage with community services to facilitate an increase in community tenure. Each resident has access to a mental health professional, individual and group therapy, and the opportunity to be involved in the development of his or her own personal treatment plan.
